What surprised or caught your attention the most about working as a sailing instructor in the U.S.?

What surprised me the most was the number of activities the children had outside of sailing. The camp was full of different sports and games, providing them with a very well-rounded experience. It wasn't just about learning to sail, but about fostering teamwork and personal development in a fun environment.

How was your experience teaching sailing in a different environment from your home country?

Teaching at a camp instead of a sailing club was completely different from what I was used to. The kids didn't always come with the goal of improving their sailing skills; instead, they were there to enjoy the summer. So, I had to adapt my methods to make the lessons more dynamic and fun. In the end, everyone had a great time on the water!

What challenges did you face, and how did you overcome them?

The biggest challenge was dealing with the fact that some kids had never sailed before and were a little scared of the water. I focused on gaining their trust by using lots of games and activities that made them feel more comfortable and safe. Slowly, they started to loosen up, and even the most nervous kids ended up enjoying themselves.

Working at a camp has changed the way I teach. It has taught me to be more patient and to find new ways to motivate kids. I've also learned a lot about the importance of teamwork and group cohesion, which are essential in that setting.
